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


## **Rostelecom – Russian national long-distance operator**

- Rostelecom national long-distance operator satisfying operators' needs in trunk network and interconnecting operators' networks into a unified transnational network
- Rostelecom the only operator that has contractual relationship with all PSTN operators
- Rostelecom central part in the system of settlements between operators for long distance services
- Rostelecom an operator that forms Russian long-distance telecommunications market


#### **Rostelecom revenue breakdown by clients**

- Other






# Existing system of settlements between operators for long distance services is...



- ✓ ... based on netting out of mutual obligations
- ✓ Termination and settlement rates are regulated by the Anti-Trust Ministry
- ✓ All settlements are carried out on the basis of the outgoing traffic data only
- ✓ ISR is calculated once a year based on the previous year's data



### Dynamics of Rostelecom's domestic longdistance traffic



- ✓ Domestic long-distance traffic grows at 15 20% p.a.
- Balance of regional operators' incoming/outgoing traffic volumes changes all the time



## Main drawbacks of the existing settlement system

#### Drawbacks


- ✓ Lack of transparency
- Lack of control over outgoing traffic data by incoming traffic data
- ✓ Distortion of settlements because of once-per-year calculation of ISR
- Absence of revenue from termination of the incoming traffic in case of regional telecoms
- Imbalance between termination rate and prices for similar local access services

#### Consequences

- Existence of offers that are much lower than the regulated price in the operators' market
- ✓ Incumbent operators are constantly underpaid



# New system – ISR «opening» and transition to the system of direct payments



Principle of settlements remains unchanged, while the order of settlements changes



## Main advantages on the new settlement system

### For Rostelecom

- ✓ Improved transparency
- ✓ Increase in revenues from incoming international traffic termination
- ✓ Increase in revenues from alternative operators

### For regional operators

- ✓ Improved transparency
- Dynamic accounting for trends of traffic growth and incoming/outgoing traffic changes
- Additional revenues resulting from obligatory termination payment by all operators
- ✓ Lower competition from IP operators



## Further steps to optimize system of settlements between operators

- Optimizing Rostelecom's linear settlement rate (LSR)
- Reducing the difference between regional operators' termination rates and local telecom services tariffs
- Changing the settlement system for the international outgoing traffic
- Optimizing end-user ILD tariffs
   (introducing flexible tariff plans and stimulation system)
